### Fleas, Ticks & Mosquitoes — Don't Let Them Bug You!

As the weather warms up, our pets enjoy the sunshine just as much as we do! Whether it's a hike through the woods or lounging on the patio, cats and dogs love spending time outdoors. But with the warmer weather comes a familiar challenge: pesky insects eager to feast on our furry friends.

Fleas, ticks, and mosquitoes are common in Ohio, and due to unpredictable weather patterns and their persistence, many pet owners consider them a year-round problem. These parasites feed by taking blood meals from mammal hosts. Wildlife such as squirrels, deer, and rabbits carry them — and they're more than happy to make cats and dogs their next stop. Outdoor cats and wild animals can easily bring these pests right onto your patio or deck.

Once fleas or ticks enter your home, they can be incredibly difficult to eliminate. Prevention is always easier — and far less stressful — than trying to manage an infestation. Even indoor cats aren't completely safe. Fleas can hitchhike inside on your clothing and then find their way to your pets. Dogs, too, can carry fleas and ticks indoors, which may later transfer to other animals in the house.

Fleas lay microscopic eggs on your pet's fur, but because the eggs aren't sticky, they fall off easily — spreading wherever your pet roams. When they hatch, the adult fleas jump back onto your pet. Their lifecycle resembles that of a butterfly: egg, larva, pupa, and adult. Depending on environmental conditions, this cycle can last weeks to months, making infestations long-lasting and difficult to control.

What's worse, these pests can carry serious diseases. Fleas may transmit tapeworms, mosquitoes can carry heartworm, and ticks can spread illnesses such as Lyme disease and anaplasmosis. The best way to prevent these risks is simple: stop the pests from biting your pet in the first place.

Fortunately, there are many products available to repel or kill these parasites — but not all are created equal, and not all are safe. Treatment options include outdoor sprays, indoor foggers, pet collars, oral medications, and topical treatments. Always consult your veterinarian before starting any treatment or using area sprays. Buying directly from your vet is often the safest option, as they source products directly from trusted pharmaceutical companies. Be sure to ask about current promotions or coupons.
